BLUE HILL!

On the line of the Republican Valley R. R. in Nebr.

Its business men, natural advantages &c.

Blue Hill, Webster Co. Neb., is a flourishing new town on the Republican branch of the B. & M. R. R., in Neb. It is situated on the N. W. quarter of Sec. 9, Township 4, Range 10, occupying eighty acres.

The location of Webster county is one of the best on the American continent. It covers towns one, two, three and four north of ranges nine, ten, and eleven west of the sixth principal meridian.

Blue Hill was laid out in September 1878 under the auspices of the B. & M. R. R., in Nebraska by the famous D. N. Smith, civil engineer of Burlington Iowa.

hundred and sixty acres of land as good as a crow ever flew over and have it under cultivation and reasonably well stocked in four or five years.

ALBERT BLUMENTHAL was the first man to run up a smoke in the town. He selected his location at the time Mr. Smith laid out the town site and while the R. R., carpenters were building the station house.

HALL & WETMORE were putting in a six ton scale and erected an implement shed 24x30 while Blumenthal was building finishing it at nearly the same time.

JAMES MURTAUGH Blacksmith, the "old reliable," hails from near Nello, Neb. He was early on the ground selecting a good location.

COL. JOHN S. HOOVER during the war times on Gen. Logan's staff, has represented W. L. Thatcher in the grain business since Nov. 16th 1879.

JOHN W. DAVIS of Hastings, opened a general merchandise store on the 23d of Nov. 1878, with John F. Grimes formerly of Knoxville Ill., in charge.

D. WEINBERG of Chicago and Hastings, opened out the first of February 1879, a fine stock of general merchandise, including Clothing, Boots, Shoes etc.

JOSEPH W. MOORE our live implement and tree dealer, one of the best salesmen in the country, opened out business on the 15th of February.

DAVID SMITH Formerly of Misonk Ill., opened a good feed and livery stable on the 19th of March. Unlike David of old, he has

MR. A. KOPFCH of Winona, Minn., opened a good stock of Hardware, Tinware and Stoves, early in February. He has a good building, good stock and first class goods with prices to suit the times.

PHILIP EVERHART formerly of Hancock county Ill., located here in March. He purchased a good farm 1 1/2 miles east of town and has built a neat five roomed residence with other outside buildings, in the town.

LOUIS BITTERS succeeded Nick Honger in the butcher trade and is erecting a substantial building in the place where the old shop stood. We need a butcher, therefore we welcome Mr. Bitters but feel impelled to say in all kindness, that we do not approve of the location of his pig pen, nor his plan of slaughtering animals in the center of the town.
