POTATO DRESSING.—Take half a

dozen potatoes, boil them, pass them

through a colander, and mix with a

tablespoonful of cream and the yolks of

two eggs; add pepper, salt and nutmeg

ped. When they are well mixed add a

teaspoonful of oil, and mix well. Put

in a hot pan, and cook for five min-

utes. Lay them in a sauce pan with plenty

of butter melted, and cook them slowly.

Turn them out when one side is done,

and serve hot as soon as both sides are

colored.
