The bill also provides for the appointment of an attorney and marshal for the district, whose fees and salaries shall be the same as those of similar officers in Washington Territory. A clerk is also to be appointed. Two terms in each year are provided for, one at Sitka and the other at Wrangel, with special sessions when necessary. The general criminal laws of Wash

ington Territory are extended over Alaska. Three justices of the peace are to be appointed, one to hold court at Sitka, one at Wrangel, and the other on deck of a revenue marine Appeals from justice courts must be taken to a district court. The fines received by justices are to be paid to a collector of customs. There are also to be three constables, one of whom is to be jailer.
