Second Congressional District Convention.

The Republican county of the Second Congressional District of Nebraska, are hereby called to meet in congressional district convention at Hastings, Nebraska, Wednesday, September 27th, 1882, at 10 o'clock a. m.

The several counties are entitled to representation in the state convention as follows: based upon the vote cast for Isaac Powers, Jr., in 1880 for reelect of the State University: Giving delegates to each one hundred and fifty (150) votes, and one delegate for the fraction of seventy-five (75) votes or over, also one delegate at large for each county.

It is recommended: First—That no proxies be admitted to the convention, except such as are held by persons residing in the counties from which the proxies are given.

The Institute closes to day with an examination of teachers.

Tickets will be on sale at points named from August 28th, to September 4th, and they require the stamp of the ticket agent at the point of sale. In order to make them good for return passage, conductors will not honor such tickets otherwise. The above points are intended to cover all G. A. R. posts on or returning either to the M. & N. or via U. P. Railway between Hastings and Grand Island to connect with all trains of the B. & M. arriving at and departing from Hastings.

Proclamation Whereas, a joint resolution was adopted by the Legislature of Nebraska at the sixteenth session thereof, and approved February 25, 1881, proposing an amendment to section one (1) article seven (7), of the Constitution of said State, and that said section as amended shall read as follows, to-wit: "Sec. 1. Every person of the age of twenty-one years or upwards, belonging to either of the following classes, who shall have resided in this state six months, and in the county, precinct or ward for the term provided by law, shall be an elector: First, Citizens of the United States; Second, Persons of foreign birth who shall have declared their intention to become citizens conformably to the laws of the United States on the subject of naturalization, at least thirty days prior to an election."

Therefore, Albinus Nance Governor of the State of Nebraska, do hereby give notice in accordance with section one (1), article (15), of the Constitution and the provisions of an act entitled "an Act to provide the manner of proposing amendments to the Constitution and submitting the same to the electors of this State," approved Feb. 13, 1877, that said proposed amendment will be submitted to the qualified voters of this State for ratification or rejection at the general election to be held on the 15th day of November, 1882.

In Witness Whereof, I hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the great seal of the State, Done at Lincoln this 10 day of July, A. D. 1882, the sixteenth of the state of Nebraska and of the independence of the United States the one hundred and seventh.
