The following offer to furnish Colorado Coal for use in the court house by the Jones & Magee Lumber Co., Red Cloud, Neb., was accepted.

To County Commissioners Webster County, Red Cloud, Neb.
Gentlemen:—We will furnish you Denver & New Orleans coal for use of your house for the winter for \$7 50 per ton.
JONES & MAGEE LUMBER CO.
The following application of John P. Bayha, county clerk was rejected.
To the Hon. Board of County Commissioners, county of Webster, State of Nebraska:
I would most respectfully ask that the board grant authority to the county clerk of said Webster county, Neb., to certify to and use the seal of the district court of said county on all Soldier Pension Claims without charge therefor.

Red Cloud, Neb., Oct. 10, 1882.
It is ordered that the sheriff have the chimney over the Co. Judge's office rebuilt and repaired immediately.
Board of Co. court's new look up for consideration the acceptance of the Inavale bridge built across the Republican river at Inavale, Webster county, Neb., by Hobson, Reese & Sawyer, after due consideration of the matter the board accepted the bridge, and ordered that the Sureties, Jones & Magee, be and are hereby released from the bond of the said Hobson, Reese and Sawyer, builders of said bridge.
The report of Chas. Buschow, county Treasurer, of receipts and disbursements from January 5th, 1882, to October, 1st, 1882, having been duly examined and approved by the board.
The county Treasurer's statement of delinquent taxes, of Chas. Buschow, county Treasurer from 1873 to 1881 inclusive, having been duly examined and approved. Board also examined the vouchers, warrants, etc., paid by Co. Treasurer, approved and cancelled the same.
The following preamble and resolution was offered and adopted by the Board of County Commissioners:
Whereas it appearing from the commissioners record that the board of county court's d. d. during the year 1878 and 1879, allowed to the county clerk at different times, claims to the amount of Four Hundred (\$400 00) Dollars against the General Fund of the county, and the same being without authority of law and in violation of the act of the Legislature regulating the fees of county officers, now therefore be it resolved, That it is the unanimous opinion of this board that the clerk, J. A. Talley, Esq., should pay back to the county Treasurer said amount, and that the clerk notify him of the same.
It appearing to the board of commissioners that from the amounts of actual delinquents for taxes issued for the years 1874, 1875, 1877, 1878, 1879 and 1880 and filed with the board from Chas. Buschow, present treasurer, in adjustment of his accounts with Webster county, Nebraska, from the 5th day of January, 1882, to the 1st day of October, 1882, that the several amounts as per settlement with ex-treasurer Jones were incorrect, in some years the amounts of said delinquents had been several funds enumerated therein file short of the actual amount as it should have been and for other years the amount reported as delinquent as per said settlement charged against the present treasurer exceeded the actual amount of the then delinquents, said overplus being erroneous. The difference in said years having been accounted for by ex-treasurer Jones, as shown by the cash book but a sufficient amount of error in assessments and refunds was not accredited on the levy in the settlement and adjustment of the accounts of said ex-treasurer Jones with Webster county, Neb., made on the 27th day of January, 1882, there-
