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 Committee on Constitution and by laws reported, and the following officers were elected for the year. John A. Hobbs, of Bloomington, president; R. M. Edmonds, of Riverton, first vice-president; J. E. Smith of Guide Rock, 2nd. vice-president, and L. V. Hardick of Bloomington, Sec. and Treas. After election of officers and appointing committees a lengthy discussion took place in regard to protection against scab and all contagious diseases which resulted in appointing a committee to draft a petition, to be presented to the legislature, to prohibit the introduction of all contagious diseases into this state, and also to try to secure an additional bounty on wolves. It is very evident that an association can secure such legislation by being combined much easier than any other way, and from the interest manifested, the Republican Valley can have a booming association, one that will represent as much capital as any wool growers society, being as we are, in a fine sheep country as there is in the west, and having more natural advantages than most localities for the business.
 A general invitation is extended to all who are wool growers, or expect to be.
 The next meeting will be held at Bloomington, January 8th 1883, in the court house at 1 o'clock p. m.
 Meetings will be held both east and west from here, to accommodate those who cannot attend at Bloomington. So, come one, come all ye shepherds.
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
