

Gowns for Judges

David Dudley Field, a famous New fork lawyer, in behalf of the New York Bar Association, has asked the judges of the Court of Appeals of that State to wear gowns hereafter, similar to those in use among Episcopal clergyman, and which indeed is the uniform of all English judges as well as the justices of the Supreme Court of the United States.

It has also been proposed that when judges enter a court room the lawyers and all others within its walls shall rise and stand uncovered until they are seated. It is thought that the greater respect thus shown to judges, and the sense of sacredness which will thus attach to the office, would raise the tone of our judiciary and improve the morale of the bench.
