J.H. St. John nominated for con-  
gress and anti-monop-greenback-  
electoratic-tion ticket, on Tuesday,  
at Hastings.

The democrats and anti-monop.  
have been advised by Ben Butler to  
fuse in Nebraska. We can not see how  
the reform is to come "about that the  
anti-monop. are fighting for by a fusion  
with the untried. The democ-  
racy had an opportunity to correct the  
evil during the last congress, if they  
had felt so disposed.

All along the line comes the cheer-  
ing news of republican success in No-  
vember. On every hand the republi-  
can nominees are met with unbound-  
ed enthusiasm, and the people are de-  
termined to elect Blaine and Logan.  
In Maine the victory is great, the lat-  
est reports showing an increased ma-  
jority of several thousand votes. The  
enthusiasm is becoming greater and  
the people's choice, Blaine and Logan,  
will be elected. On the other hand the  
"roses fade and fall," and so with  
Cleveland—his history is fading, and  
by November will pass away, and he  
will be relegated to the rear ranks of  
his party to be forgotten. The people  
have said and so must it be.

The Anti-Monop. Convention at Lincoln.  
By request we print the following  
from the Lincoln Democrat.

After the recess yesterday afternoon  
the convention proceeded to make ar-  
rangements for the conference with the  
greenbackers, who were holding a con-  
vention in City Hall. A committee  
was appointed to confer with a like  
committee from the greenbacker, rela-  
tive to the matter of fusion. Messrs.  
Westover, Mills, Cook, Houston and  
McGraw were appointed as such com-  
mittee.

The committee on credentials then  
reported and the delegates were seated.  
The committee on permanent organi-  
zation reported the following.

For permanent chairman, Mr. Man-  
chester of Hamilton county; for vice  
president H. M. Woods, of Cass county;  
David Hale, of Washington county;  
Ed. Aspinwall, of Douglas county; J.  
Burrows, of Geary county; D. A. Still,  
of Otoe county; H. S. Alley, of Cedar  
county. As secretary Mr. O. S. Hen-  
de.

The chairman, Mr. Manchester took  
the chair and expressed his thanks to  
the convention for the honor they had  
conferred.

A motion was made that the con-  
vention go in body to meet B. F. Butler.  
The committee which was sent to con-  
fer with the greenback committee re-  
lative to a fusion convention reported  
that where each party had a delegate  
from a county, making two, that each  
delegate be allowed to cast half the  
votes to which the county was entitled.  
It was adopted.

A committee of three was appointed  
to invite the greenbackers to join with  
the anti-monop. in the academy of  
music. Messrs. Allen Root, W. W.  
Gibson and Albert Ewing composed  
the committee. A committee was ap-  
pointed to receive and entertain Gen.  
B. F. Butler. Messrs. K. Slater, W. E.  
Peck, S. Palmer, and Ex-Gov. Butler  
were appointed as such committee.

After some confusion the convention  
adjourned to City Hall to meet and re-  
ceive Gen. Butler.

IN THE EVENING  
after the speech by B. F. Butler, the  
convention was again called to order in  
the academy of music about 9 o'clock.  
A motion was made that the con-  
vention proceed to nominate five electors.  
A substitute was offered providing for  
the appointment of a committee of five  
to confer with a like committee from  
the democrats with instruction and  
power to choose five electors to place  
upon the fusion ticket. The substitute  
was carried.

There was some confusion and a vast  
deal of boisterous speaking in which it  
was claimed that Mr. Root was not a  
delegate but was simply the agent of  
Butler.

It was announced that the green-  
backers would meet with the anti-  
monop. at nine o'clock this morning  
and the convention adjourned.
