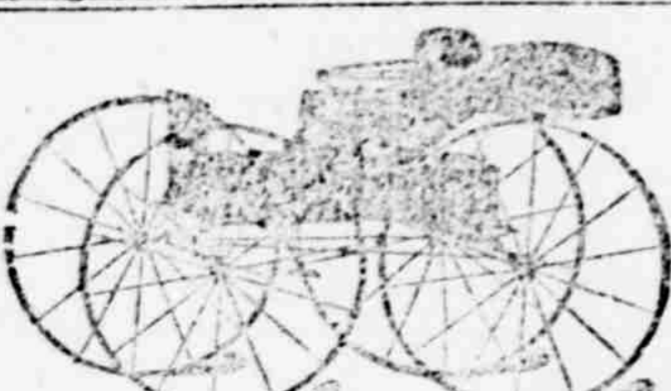

There is no reason why republicans
should leave their party and go off
with the many so styled reform parties.
The republican party has made the
country what it is today—one of the

A Change in the Situation.
The Troy Times will be entirely frank
with its Utica contemporary, and say
that it thought—and thought honestly
—that Mr. Blaine could not carry the
State of New York. But Mr. Blaine
has proven himself to be such a mag-
nificent candidate, has borne himself
in the election contest so like the great
Parliamentary leader he was when,
in the House, he confronted single-hand-
ed the hosts of Democracy and trea-
son; has manifested such wisdom in all
his public acts, and especially in his
letter of acceptance—a letter which in
breadth of thought and in statesman-
like comprehension of the living issues
of the day is fit to live in the classics
of American composition and discus-
sion, and which has grown so vastly in
public estimation, dwarfing all his
competitors as a giant dwarfed the
petty things made into human images,
that the Troy Times now not only be-
lieves he will carry the State of New
York, but that he will be elected by a
larger popular and electoral majority
than has been given to any
president since Abraham Lincoln's
second election, save only the
unexampled choice of General Grant
over Horace Greeley in 1872. From
the day of Mr. Blaine's nomination, to
the present time he has grown stronger
and stronger, and we believe that he
will continue to grow in popular con-
fidence and support to the end. The
ferce fires that were to consume him
have only brought out the gold—the
pure metal—that was in him, while
the electric light turned upon Cleve-
land has shown him to be only a mass
of mental and moral weakness. The
campaign has made a shipwreck of his
character, and Democracy would yester-
day have hailed with greater delight
a letter of declination from his hands
than the feeble acceptance it was
obliged to receive, if he had only had
the courage and the manliness to give
such a document to the world—*Agri-
culture Journal*, Sep. 1.
