Commissioners' Proceedings.

Red Cloud, Neb. Jan. 13th, 1885. Board met in regular session. J. L. Miller, John McCallum, I. B. Hampton, county commissioners, J. P. Bayha county clerk present.

Proceedings Dec. 23rd, 1884, read and approved. On motion board reconsidered their action relative to rejecting the claims of A. F. Naulteous M. D. and W. W. Rockwood as recorded in county commissioners record Dec. 23rd 1884, page 514.

I. B. Hampton was appointed a committee to return or cause to be returned to the Nebraska Lumber Co the pile driver which the county has had in use for some time past.

Board now made a contract with A. C. Hosmer and Geo. J. Warren, at Red Cloud, Neb., to publish the county commissioners proceedings of Webster Co. Neb. They agreeing to publish the said proceedings for the year 1885, commencing from Jan. 1st, 1885, and continuing for one year.

Each firm to be paid \$45 per annum therefor, and each of said firms are to have furnished to them a copy of the proceedings of the board at their own expense. Said contract to be payable quarterly.

Board adjourned to Wednesday, Jan. 14th, 1885.
