Commissioners' Proceedings.

RED CLOUD, NEB., Feb. 2, 1885.

Board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment, Jacob L. Miller, John McCullum, Isaiah B. Hampson, commissioners; J. P. Bayha, clerk.

Board of county commissioners now took up the books, papers, and vouchers of the county treasurer and continued their examination of the same throughout the day.

Board adjourned to February 3, 1885.

SECOND DAY.

Board met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Board continued their examination of the books, papers, and vouchers, of the county treasurer preparatory to making the annual settlement, board then adjourned to February 4, 1885.

THIRD DAY.

Board met pursuant to adjournment, all members present.

Board continued their examination of the books, papers, vouchers, and general statement of finances of the county treasurer.

Board finally completed the settlement with the county treasurer at 12 o'clock M., having found all books, papers, vouchers, and financial statement correct and approved, the same in full, as hereinbefore set forth.

J. S. Hasty, contractor for repairing the Guide Rock bridge across the Republican river, notified the board of county commissioners now in session, that the repairs on said bridge were completed, as follows:

Red Cloud, Neb., Feb. 2, 1885.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners, of Webster county, Nebraska, Messrs.: The bridge at Guide Rock is completed, and is now open for travel, and I await your action in the matter.

Thereupon at 12 o'clock M. the board of county commissioners took a recess until evening to go to Guide Rock, Nebraska, to examine said bridge. Board of county commissioners returned from Guide Rock, after examining all repairs on the bridge aforesaid, and after some discussion and due consideration of the completion and repair of said bridge by D. S. Hasty. On motion the board duly rejected said repairs made on said Guide Rock bridge for the reason that the repairs were not made according to contract, and the county clerk was ordered to notify D. S. Hasty of this action of the board.

The following report of Chas. Buschow, county treasurer, approved:

Board met pursuant to adjournment all members present.

Objection having been made to the allowance of a poor claim in favor of Mrs. E. Weller allowed Jan. 15, 1885, the board on motion reconsidered their action allowing said claim, and then on motion rejected the said claim.

By an agreement made it is hereby ordered by the board that the financial statement of the county treasurer be published in the "Red Cloud Call" and Webster County "Topics" at \$15 each, bearing the same rate as last year.

Board now application employed J. G. Dodd to write up and complete a delinquent real estate book, showing all lands in each section in the county of Webster, Nebraska, for the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75), the same to be paid when book is completed.

Report of J. P. Bayha, county clerk, of criminal fees paid into county treasury from January 5, 1882, to Sept. 4, 1884 and duplicate receipts filed with him, was submitted and accepted.

Statement of fines assessed and collected by F. C. Buschow J. P. from Jan. 1, 1884 to Jan. 1, 1885, was presented and accepted.

Application of J. P. Bayha, county clerk, the board allowed him fifty dollars per month for three months for an assistant on extra work to be paid out of and not to exceed the fees of the office.

Board of commissioners now appointed Messrs. Gillham & Rickards, county attorneys for Webster county, Nebraska, for the year 1885, to be paid five hundred dollars (\$500) per annum, payable quarterly in warrants of said county for such service. They accepted the appointment.

Ordered by the board that the county treasurer transfer from county sinking fund to special bridge fund the sum of twelve hundred and thirty-six and 23 cents.

Ordered that county treasurer transfer from the general school district account of the county to the county general fund the sum of twenty-one and 88 cents, the amount of difference between the general school district account and school district balances.

Separate being an old balance erroneously carried forward at the old treasurer's settlement Jan. 5, 1882.

Ordered that county treasurer transfer from the general school bond account of the county to the county general fund the sum of seven cents, the amount of difference between the general district bond account of the county to the school bond balance, separately carried forward at the old treasurer's settlement Jan. 5, 1882.

The following resolution was offered and adopted by the board, on motion:

Resolved, That it be recommended that all assessors for the several precincts of the county of Webster meet at the court house in Red Cloud on April 2nd, 1885, for the purpose of establishing a uniform basis on which to assess the property of Webster County, Nebraska, and receive their books and blanks at same time.

Board now adjourned to April 1.
