- ---THE CRISIS WITH RUSSIA

Report that the British Gaverament See Addressed Serious Remonstrances 160 Russia

LONDON, March 13. - The Calinet met al noon. The unusually early hour at once attracted attention. Reports were quickly spread that a crisis had been considered. Interest in the meeting was seen intense. This was warranted by several incidents which preceded and attended the council. Immediately before the conference Colonel George A. Mande, Equerry-in-Chief to the Queen, called upon Gladstone and had a long interview. Among the rumors to which this gave rise was one to the effect that Her Majesty had been advised that the Indian situation is grave, and required vigorour and decisive action, and that the Queen rather urgently insisted on her Government doing something. This and similar stories attracted a large crowd to Downing street, and before the Cabinet was in session the Prime Minister's official residence was surcounded by a large crowd. Up to three clock it was not publicly known what the Ministers had done. It is reported they decided to address serious representations to the Russian Government, that if conflicts with the Ameer's troops occur Rossia must accept the consequences, as England to bound to guard Afghan territory.
