The "spring Easeh Lynching.

Our Blue Hill correspondent says: News reached us Sunday afternoon that at about one o'clock that morning a mob of about 50 or 60 men took Thos Jones and Mrs Taylor from their home on the Biue la miles east of Spring Ranch and hung them to an iron bridge a few rods distant. This Taylor outfit, together with other rowdies who associated with them, were supposed to have been implicated in recent depredations committed in that vicinity, also in the murder of Edwin Robert which transpired about a month ago. The bodies remained banging until 2 p. m., Sunday, when an inquest was held. Four other parties were in the house at the tip, e, and were bound and guarded until near daylight, and three of them were told to leave the country In the meantime, William and John Jones were notified to leave the country within 30 days. The two hung were given a short time, which they occupied in praying, then the rope was placed about their necks, tied to stringer of the bridge and at a given signal were shoved off. Tom Jones' neck was broken, but his sister, Mrs Taylor died the terrible death of strangula-
