FROM ALABAMA.

As a number of my friends wanted me to write to them I will answer all in one in your valuable paper. I will tell you what I think of this part of Alabama. It has been a very rich country but since the war it has been badly run down by renting and farming with inferior tools. There is most all kinds of land here in a radius of a few miles, red, yellow, and black land and clay foundation and there is sandy land. There is plenty of timber of nearly all kinds, and fruit such as apples, peaches, pears and cherries and berries, such as blackberries, raspberries, strawberries, gooseberries, and huckleberries. We can raise cotton, wheat, oats, rye, sugar cane, and Irish potatoes and all kinds of garden vegetables that will grow any where will grow here and land is cheap, ranging from five to fifty dollars per acre. Privileges are very good. Taxes are low here, not quite one percent, and we are exempt one hundred and fifty dollars worth of house and kitchen furniture, one yoke of oxen, wagon and twenty shovels, and bread stuffs enough to last six months. I have no desire to come back to Webster county to live and pay eight per cent. taxes. Now if the don't find place in the waste basket you may hear from this part again.


