 Proceedings of previous meeting read and approved.  
 Report of E. O. Parker, J. P. Guide Rock precinct, approved and claims allowed as per report.  
 The following claims were audited and allowed and warrants to be drawn on county general fund.  
 J. G. Dodd, making real estate delinquent record \$25; Wm. Sawyer labor on Guide Rock bridge \$2.25; J. B. Fisk, M. D. poor bill \$24; C. G.
