



At least thirty bodies are deposited in vaults in the cemeteries of New York awaiting incineration at the new crematory shortly to be opened. Some of them belong to very prominent famiies. The incineration will be a triump over previous records. The furnac will be heated to 2,500 degrees Fahre beit. The body placed on the co falque will descend to the furnace in basement, and in a few minutes seven pounds of ashes in beautiful terra cott. veses will rise where the corpse once rested. The andience will not be aware as the catafalque is covered and the hody descends unnoticed. The funeral services can still proceed and not be in-terrupted. The relatives can wait and get the ashes. Any religious serviced in the world can be conducted, for the erematory will not be orthodox. 12cense, myrrh and high-flavored spices will not be used. There is no necessity. as no odor whatever exhales from the furnace. Already two pottery manufacturers have put in bids for the terre cotta vases. Of course rich people can furnish their own vases if they de The crematory will furnish only the terra cotta vases. Two rare specimens of Etruscan vases called adicule, over 2.000 years old, will be placed in the crematory office as specimens of antique art and taste. They came from Capua, Italy, and were purchased by the company at a round sum of money.

A common-sized vase will hold the ashes. There are only four pounds of ashes to every leep pounds of flesh. The ashes will be bleached to a pearly whiteness by the process of a superior heaf generator.—New York Mail and Exi-
