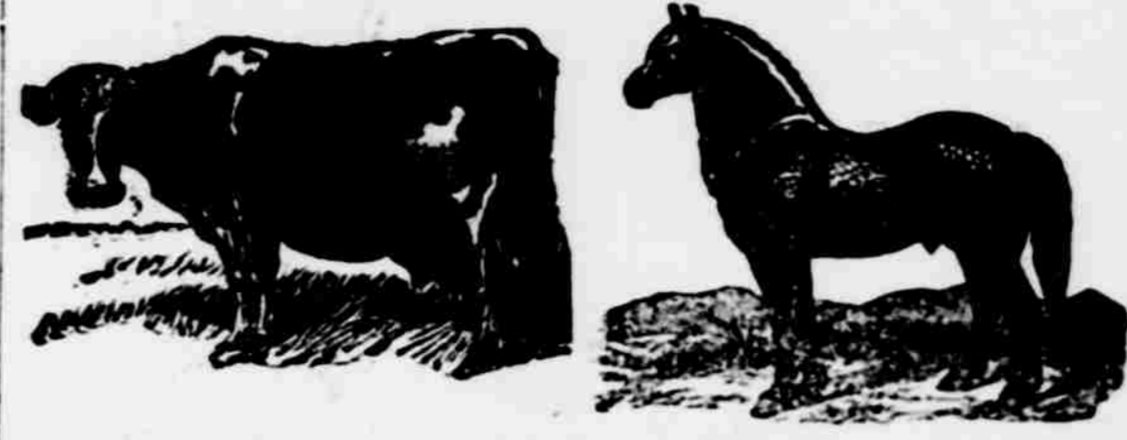

Board of commissioners met pur-
suant to adjournment. Present J. L.
Miller and Isaiah B. Hampton county
commissioners, J. P. Bayha county
clerk.

No. 7.

Report of E. O. Parker J. P. Guide
Rock precinct presented and approved
and claims attached allowed.

and allowed and warrants to be drawn
on the county general fund for the

is hereby made for road district No. 27

Ordered by the board that an appro-
priation of \$15 or so much thereof as
may be necessary is hereby made for
road district No. 21 for building bridges
and culverts to be paid when completed.

Ordered by the board that \$250 be
transferred from the county sinking
fund to the court house fund and county
treasurer is instructed to make said
transfer.

Board ordered that county warrants
be drawn by the clerk at as early a day
as possible for all audited and allowed
accounts, allowed on general, bridge
and court house funds now outstanding
for which warrants were to be
drawn, and issue the same.
