Residents of Camden, N. J., Excited Over the Death of a Young Irish Girl. PRILADELPHIA, PA., August 15,-The people of Camden, N. J., are considerably larmed over what appears to have been a death from cholers. The Coroner of Camden, who is also a physician, was notified yester in y morning that Margaret Healey, a

young Irish domestic on the farm of Edward P. Hunt, at White Horse, had died suddenly on Wednesday evening. Arriving there at noon the Coroner found the body in an advanced stage of decomposition. So offensive was it that it had become necessary to remove it to an open shed. On investigating the case Coroner Beale found that the dead girl came from Ireland two weeks ago. Her brother, Michael Healey of Philadelphia obtained a place for her with Farmer Hunt, ten days before she belonging to Mr. Dunlap, eight miles from died. A Broken Fan in a Pennay loania Coal Mina Causes the Death of Iwelve Men. WHERESTARDS, PA., August 12, ... Shortly

as it was well known that the gas would accumulate. About seventy-five men were in the mine at the time when the work he gan. The workmen repairing the fan were the first overcome with the gas. About as hour later the same fate happened to many more in the mine. Hefore the men fairly realized their danger more than twenty were unconscious. Those who could then escape did so. Superintendent John Teasfale and several of his men became unconscious and were with difficulty resened. Others went down and in the face of immense difficulties and in spite of being continually overpowered with gas got out all but ten men. Four of those brought out were dead. Among those seriously overcome with gas and padly injured are Burt Tromer, Thomas Hutchinson, John Andrews, John Teas iale, jr., Henry Croup, John Eastley, William Good, Fred Howe and others whose names can not be learned at present writing. The boss at the mine says he notified the men before they entered the mine that the fan had stopped, and that it was not safe for them to enter, and the mine was filling with gas. This is denied by the miners and laborers. They, on the contrary, say that he told them to go to work,

THAT THE PAN WAS UNDER but could be repaired and put in working order in an hour. When they entered everything appeared to be all right until they began to smell the fatal sulphur fumes and before they could get out many were overcome and suffocated. The disaster is considered singular in its nature, and stands alone and unprecedented in the bistory of mining. It could have been easily foreseen and prevented, but being one of those singular oversights, the cause escaped notice.
