There will be universal satisfaction among honest men of all parties over the assurance that John Sherman, of Ohio, will be his own successor in the senate at Washington. A united republican caucus has so decided, and as the republicans have a clear majority, notwithstanding the iniquitous ratification of the frauds in Hamilton county by a democratic supreme court the result can confidentially be discounted in advance. The election of Ohio last fall in the most disgraceful political episode of the year. The proposition of the ballot by the democratic "reformers" of Cincinnati was boldly devised and brazenly carried out. Exposed by a non-partisan committee of the best citizens of Hamilton county it was defended and ratified by the supreme court in decision which over-damned its authors the eyes of reputable men and lawyers through out the country. The conspiracy whose sole object was to defeat the re-election of one of the strongest and best of senators has happily failed. Senator Sherman's broad and subtle intellect, well equipped mind, and long experience in national legislation will be at the disposal of his state and the nation for another six years, while his reckless and ambitious Lilliputian competitor, John McLean, will continue in his attempts to secure notoriety through the columns of the Cincinnati Enquirer. Some of these days when age has perhaps brought wisdom, experience and moderation, McLean will discover that the public distinguishes between reputation and notoriety in political as well as in business, in public life as well as in the social circle.—*See.*
