### CURRENT COMMENT.

**GENERAL ROSECRANS** has been confirmed Register of the Treasury.

**GOVERNOR HILL** has signed the bill permitting women to practice law in New York.

**WILLIAM K. VANDERBILT** will pay five thousand dollars for the use of a London residence for ten weeks this summer for himself and wife.

**FRANCIS MURPHY** endorses the Dow liquor law just passed by the Ohio Legislature, and says it will close one-third of the saloons in the State.

In Tamaulipas, Mexico, the bitterest feeling was reported existing between Governor Caudillo and his old time enemies recently put in power by President Diaz.

The remarkable manifesto issued recently to the Black Sea fleet by the Czar produced a temporary feeling of panic in all European houses, but the feeling was soon removed by the subsequent promulgation of the peaceful views of the new Government of Greece.

At Albany, N. Y., recently, Attorney General O'Brien applied to Alton B. Parker, one of the Justices of the Supreme Court, for the appointment of a receiver for the New York Broadway Surface railroad, as provided in the bill recently passed regarding the charter of that company, and Mr. John O'Brien was therupon appointed.

Know an Indian Territory special it is learned that a general expulsion of intruders or "shoemakers" upon the Cherokee strip has begun. The work of removal is in charge of Captain Price and a company of the 5th United States cavalry. The "shoemakers" number several hundred, and many of them have built houses and made other improvements.

News has reached Texarkana, Ark., from sections in and about upper Red river of a plague among the fish of that and tributary streams. The cause of the fatal disease is not known and the incident is a mystery to the oldest inhabitant in the valley. The plague is progressing slowly and much apprehension is felt that it will be very far-reaching.

Damages were claimed by Goodell for breach of contract, the Western Union having failed to make good a contract he held with the Atlantic & Pacific Telegraph Company, which the Western Union absorbed.

A recent telegram from Stillwater, Minn., says: The family and farm hands of L. H. Townsend, who resided about fifteen miles from town, were thrown into a panic yesterday by a sudden loud report and upheaval of dirt and stones four hundred feet into the air at a point near the farm house. Townsend thinks the eruption due to an earthquake. A hole twenty-five feet deep was torn in the earth and stones buried out by the explosion were found half a mile away from the farm.

A large number of petitions were reported coming to the Senate relating to oleomargarine and other imitations of butter. The great majority of the petitions are from agricultural and dairy associations and favor the bill proposing an internal revenue tax of ten cents a pound on the product named, and regulating its manufacture and sale, while the opposing petitions are from produce exchanges and similar commercial bodies protesting against any such tax and suggesting that it would be sufficient for Congress to require that such products be properly labeled.

In the Court of Claims at Washington recently, Judge Davis delivered the decision of the court in relation to the liability of the government for the French spoliation claims in which the Chief Justice and all judges concur. The court, after discussing the law, is of the opinion that the claims are valid obligations against the country which sacrificed the rights of its individual citizens to secure a great national advantage, and that the treaties of 1863 and 1863 with France, and the treaty of 1849 with Spain, do not apply to the spoliation claims, and therefore the claimants should recover.

**MR. CHARLES HUTCHINS**, of Boston, appeared before the Senate Postal committee recently in regard to a change of the law respecting rates of postage on second-class matter at letter-carrier offices. By the present law, he says, the postage on monthly periodicals, when delivered by carriers in the city where published, is from five to thirty-five times as much as when transported to any other part of the country, including free delivery at all other carrier offices, or from five to thirty-five times as much as is charged on weekly papers for delivery in the city where published or elsewhere. He advocated the passage of the pending bill, making the postage on second-class publication deposited in the letter-carrier office for delivery uniform at one cent a pound.

## NEWS OF THE WEEK.

### CONGRESSIONAL.

In the Senate on the 1st, several complications from the Secretary of the Treasury were received, the information of the House was received for several bills of a local nature passed. At two o'clock the Pension bill was placed before the Senate, but was taken up by the Committee on Appropriations, and then sent back to the Senate.

After routine business in the Senate on the 1st, the Pension bill was taken up after several amendments had been offered and the one making pensions not less than \$14 per month and amounting to more than \$100,000,000 was adopted, the bill finally passed by a vote of 41 to 1. The Bankruptcy bill was then taken up by the Committee on Appropriations, and was referred to the House, and the House then went to Committee of the Whole on the Senate amendment to the Post Office bill. After final action the House adjourned.
