The use of a fictitious name or address for this purpose is also made unlawful and subject to the same penalties.

CONGRESS.

AFTER passing several bills of private and local character the Senate on the 15th held an Executive session for a few minutes and then resumed consideration of the Naval Appropriation bill, which after further debate and amendment passed. After a long debate the Pacific Railroad Funding bill was laid aside and the report of the Committee on Privileges and Elections of the Washington County (Texas) case taken up, and the Senate soon adjourned. When the House met the Senate bill to enable the President to protect the interests of the United States in Panama was received and referred.
