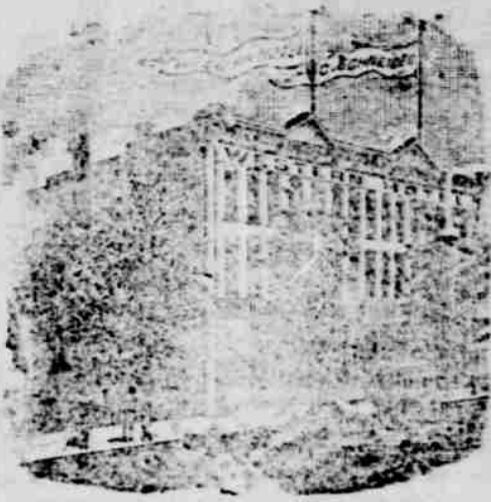

MY DEAR WHITE:—Yours of the 20th last at hand. I need not say how hearty I appreciate the work, which I hear from other sources besides your letter, you and your friends are doing in my behalf. You are quite right in saying to your friends in Blue Hill that I am in no manner pledged to either the First National Bank or to any other bank in this city or county. My enemies have seen fit here and there to question my competency for the office. If elected however, I think I shall not only demonstrate my competency but also my ability to fill without any assistance, the office of treasurer of this county. I have to say here and now that neither the First National Bank nor any of its officers nor anybody authorized to speak for it has ever mentioned the subject of the county deposits to me nor to any one for me, nor have I ever pledged myself nor have I any understanding directly or indirectly with that bank or any of its officers or anybody acting for it, or any other bank or any of its officers as to where the county deposits shall be placed. I do not propose that anybody or any institution shall dictate to me how and in what manner I shall fill the office if elected.
