Extract of Reminiscences of the War.
(BY UCLER SAN'S BOY.)

Although at the time of my enlistment I was a man of mature age, I still entertained some of the ideas of my boyhood days, when I regarded military officers as greatly superior to other men, the supposed superiority being in proportion to their rank. But when I had been a short time in the service I was forcibly reminded of a story I once heard of two back woods men who were for the first time taking an admiring look at a locomotive, while they were looking around the engine with its wonderful machinery the engineer, who was a small and not very muscular man, appeared on the scene and began rubbing and polishing the boiler and puffing giant. After watching him for some time one of the men said to the other: "Say Jim, it does not take much of a man to be an engineer, does it?" In the application of this anecdote I do not exactly mean that it does not take much of a man to be a commissioned officer, but I do mean that rank is not a reliable criterion by which to measure the capacity of men or by which to estimate their claims to public consideration and recognition for which as a rule honors are worthily bestowed. There were cases in which the man instead of receiving a promotion because of his merits was simply placed in a position where he could tyrannize over others, many of whom were his superiors in every thing that constitutes a good officer, but practically, he does not take much of a man to wear shoulder straps, and I fail to see the propriety of making the wide distinction between officers and privates that is usually made. In nothing is this discrimination more noticeable, or more unjust than in the matter of pensions.

the above questions. The first question, "how does it look?" is not a very important question, and any one can answer it, not all would not answer it alike, for it may look all right to some and all wrong to others owing to the kind of spectacles through which they look. Our pension laws were enacted and are from time to time amended for the ostensible purpose of relieving the sufferings, and providing for the wants of those who are suffering from wounds and disabilities contracted in the service on the ground of justice, it having been said in congress that the government should be just first, generous afterward. That sounds nicely but at the slow rate at which justice is moving the majority of old soldiers will not live long enough to share its benefits, while the "generosity" which is to follow is so far in the dim distance that it may be attended to their children's children in some future presidential or political campaign when votes will be needed and will do the most good.
