#### Co-operative Stores Wrong.

We notice that several co-operative stores have been started by the Alliance people in various parts of the state. This we believe to be detrimental to the farmers. Our merchants are now selling goods very close and we doubt the advisability of farmers trying to sell goods on a loss margin. In fact we do not believe that it can be done. Another bad feature about co-operative stores is that promoters seek to do, by the introduction of such stores, just what they are opposed to, namely: destroy other people's business to enhance their own. It is a poor theory. Farmers should organize for their own protection and use every legitimate end to obtain it, and in their efforts to do so they will find THE CHIEF ever ready to help them, at such times and ways as the editor deems most potent, but farmers are not the only people who are suffering from various causes at the present time. Placed in the same category with the farmer are the merchants, the tradesmen, the storekeepers, the printers, and in fact most every business is lacking that vitality that it ought to have, but what the cause is we are unable to tell.

The farmer and merchant, the capitalist and artisan, in fact all men have interests that are identical, and the great problem is "How shall we solve them to the best interest of all?" Is it by antagonizing every other man's business not in harmony with our own, or is it a better way to organize and demand our just deserts, and aim to harmonize other differences to better our own? Intelligent discussion of these great problems will do more good than all the isms that may come.
