MEMORIAL DAY.



It was Observed Very Appropriately in this City.

A Very Large Crowd in Attendance.

OUR NATION'S DEAD. IN RED CLOUD.

the memorial services were carried on upon a large scale. At one o'clock the procession, nearly a mile long, formed on 4th avenue at the intersection of Webster street headed by Coules cornet band, followed by May or Marsh, city council, city officials, 44 young ladies in a large wagon, Garfield post, school children, relief corps, and citizens in wagons, etc. The procession, went north to 6th avenue, west to Seward street, south to Division street and thence to Woodlawn cemetery where the large throng witnessed the decorating of the soldiers graves by the G. A. R.'s Relief Corps, and little children, with the usual ceremonies, after which the people returned to the city, and finished the days doing at the opera house, where one of the best programs that has ever been given for memorial services was carried out, consisting of speeches, songs by the Red Cloud quartet, recitations, etc. One of the features was the marching of about 30 little boys dressed up in soldiers uniform, who performed the evolutions of the march in good style, with Horace Spanogle as captain, and Earl Pond as drummer boy. This feature drew forth from the breasts of the old soldiers many tokens of approval, at the close of which the curtains were drawn aside presenting the Goddess of Liberty, Miss Gertrude Pond, in an attitude of giving her benediction to the affair. The Goddess was guarded by soldiers. After an appropriate song by the quartet the services were closed and the large crowd adjourned.

The idea of the little soldier boys and the little girls representing the states was original with the ladies of the W. R. C. and was certainly one of the very best features to draw attention. The little girls were in charge of Wm. Kames and drawn to the cemetery by his large team in a wagon prepared especially for the occasion. It was an innovation of the regular order of things in Red Cloud and created a great deal of favorable comment. Upon the whole the old soldiers and the ladies of the W. R. C. did themselves great credit this year in their observance of Memorial day. The boys should try to make each succeeding year better and better, and by so doing until the noblest sentiments of patriotism in the breasts of the rising generations that are to do a like service to the old soldiers who must take their places in the cold and silent tomb as the years roll by. It is a well defined fact that in a few more years these brave boys will all have passed away, and then the duty of observing Memorial day will fall upon the sons and daughters of the old soldiers of today, and it should be a pleasant duty to tell them, and retell them the old story of the battle field and of those who gave all that we might be one of the greatest nations on the earth. Teach the children then, to revere these things, and in after years they will fill the place of the present generation fully.
