Below I give a description of what I believe to be one of the best general purpose farm fences, as it combines strength durability, neatness, cheapness and complete portability. It also can be made either in the field on the posts or in the shop or barn.

For common farm fence I would make it four feet high, or for those who wish a cheap poultry fence I would make it six feet high. The cost would be about as follows




