Dr. Talmage Discourses on the Fishing For Souls.

In a late sermon at Brooklyn Rev. T. DeWitt Talmage paid his attention to the theological disputes which are agitating the churches, and gave some practical advice to both parties. His text was Matthew, iv. 21: "James, the son of Zebedee, and John, his brother, in a ship with Zebedee, their father, mending their nets." He said:

And if the time should ever come when the immensity of the world's population could not be fed by the vegetables and meats of the land, the sea has an amount of animal life that would feed all the populations of the earth and fatten them with a food that by its phosphorus would make a generation brainy and intellectual beyond anything that the world has ever imagined. My text takes us among the Galilean Ashermen. 


