DRAINING ORCHARDS.

Fruit Trees Are Greatly Benefited by Artificial Drainage. We have had occasion at different times to witness the advantages of good drainage to apple orchards, and the insoaked roots. Wet feet are not good for them. Large bearing trees have



been sometimes greatly imploved by artificial drainage where staming in soils and subsoils liable to be leavily soaked by rains. The tile has been laid two and a half or three feet below the surface; and to escape the danger of the pipe becoming filled with the small roots, it has been placed midway between the twd rows of trees, a rod distant from each, as shown in the annexed cut, the tile being in the portion of soil especially filled with the small fibers, that were particularly benefited by it -- Country Gentleman.


