Traffic in Baking Powder. Section 1. Any person who shall knowingly sell or procure the sale, or offer for sale any package or can of Baking Powder, containing any Amin the English language "This Bak. neighbor. ing Powder contains Ammonia" in equivalent thereto in length, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished departure, but their loss is her gain. by a fine not less than \$20 nor more than \$50; shall be confined in the county jail not less than ten or more tuan twenty days or by both fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the

Sec. 2. The sale or offer for sale of the substance mentioned in the foregoing section in packages not stamped, marked, branded or labelled as therein required, shall be prima-facie evidence of knowledge of the character of said substance, on the part of the person so selling or offering for sale and his employer.

Sec. 3. This act shall be in force

on and after its passage. Note-An incident occurred in the house when the senate bill came up for passage, in reference to an amendment proposed by Mr. Diment. This was opposed by several members.
