Mr. Editor: The city council has taken a step in the right direction to protect home merchants by placing a heavy license on peddlers. While this move in our council would seem at first sight to be solely in the interest of the merchants it is a protection to all consumers against being imposed upon with inferior goods at supposed low prices, and the money carried out of our community, which is a double injury to all laboring classes and against home industry.

It would be a good thing for the people of this community and town had we more manufactures such as the Red Cloud and Amboy mills in order to give our farmers a home market for their products.

It is to our interest to patronize these institutions and it will keep what little money we have left circulating among our home people instead of sending it to foreign towns for their benefit.

In looking for flour the other day I found every merchant handling foreign flour so I had to go to one of the feed stores to get a sack of home flour. A little council legislation against peddlers of foreign flour might give us a better home market. For one I will patronize our home institutions **A FARMER.**

Ordinance No. 53.
An ordinance amending section four of Ordinance No. 45. Entitled, an ordinance providing for the levying and collecting of a license tax on occupation and business carried on within the limits of the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska, to regulate the same and to repeal ordinance No. 23, entitled, an ordinance relative to licensing peddlers, booth stands or stall keepers, wheel of fortune, circuses, menageries, side shows, revolving wheels and shooting galleries.

Be it ordained by the mayor and council of the city of Red Cloud, Neb.

Sec 1. That section four (4) of ordinance No. forty-five (45), entitled, an ordinance providing for the levying and collecting of a license tax on occupation and business carried on within the limits of the city of Red Cloud, Neb., to regulate the same and to repeal ordinance No. 23, entitled, an ordinance relative to licensing peddlers, booth stands or stall keepers, wheel of fortune, circuses, menageries, side shows, revolving wheels and shooting galleries, be amended to read as follows: Any and all fire insurance companies doing business in the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska, shall pay into the city treasury the sum of five (5) dollars per year.

Sec 2. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec 3. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its adoption and publication according to law.
