Entitled, an ordi-nance providing for the levying and collecting of a license tax on occupa-tion and business carried on within the limits of the city of Red Cloud, Ne-braska, to regulate the same and to repeal ordinance No. 53, entitled, an ordi-nance relative to licensing poddlers, booth stands or stall keepers, wheel of fortune, circuses, menageries, side shows, revolving wheels and shooting galleries.

Be it ordained by the mayor and coun-oil of the city of Red Cloud, Neb.

cil of the city of Red Cloud, Neb.

Bro 1. That section four (4) of ordinance No. forty-five (47), entitled, an ordinance providing for the levying and collecting of a license tax on occupation and business carried on within the limits of the city of Red Cloud, Nebr., to regulate the same and to repeal ordinance No. 82, entitled, an ordinance relative to licensing peddlers, booth stands or stall keepers, wheel of fortune, circuses, munageries, side shows, revolving swings and shooting galleries, be amended to read as follows: Any and all fire insurance companies doing business in the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska, shall pay into the city treasury the sum of five (5) dollars per year.

Bro. 2. That all ordinances and parts
