## Educational Department.

Decoration Day exercises in many schools of Webster county which were received too late for publication.

The trees set out by the schools on Arbor day are growing nicely. They should be mulched to keep them growing during the months of July and August.

The following suggestions are part of a circular sent to school directors few weeks ago:

1. Good men permanently located in the district should be elected as school officers.

2. Those districts that are out of debt and have the site of the schoolhouse fixed permanently should make provision at this annual meeting to fence the school grounds.

3. Out-houses and school-houses should be scrubbed and cleaned—all obscene language and marks removed from them-before the next term of

4. Teachers and pupils need books etc., with which to work as greatly as as the farmer needs plows, harness, etc. Boards should act premptly in furnishing all needed supplies.

5. Members of the board and patrons should visit their school eral times during each term.

6. If nothing is to be reported in some spaces of the directors' annual report fill them with a cross, X. Amount on hand July, 1891, must be the same amount reported last year as on hand at that date. Being exact ill avoid having the report retu for correction, will save time.

7. Every board should subscribe for the North Western Journal of Education, at cost to the district, as it is the official organ of the state superintendent, and it will keep them posted in points in school law and recent decisions.

8 As our County Teachers' Insitute will be in session at the time that the annual report must be made, directorare specially requested to bring their reports with them and visit the institute if possible. All school officers and patrons should visit the institute.

9. As the teachers' institute for 1893 will be held during the last two weeks in March, school boards should arrange their terms so that all schools will be closed during the institute.
