Public sympathy has not been denied to their ironworkers at Homestead in their resistance to the Pinkerton hirelings, but it must be understood that public approval of such sentiments as those expressed at Chicago is impossible.

The same mistaken notion concerning the rights of the laborer are re sponsible for the slaughter in mines of Idaho, and there can be no doubt that the striking miners were spurred on by the intemperate talk of political demagogues who seek to array the workingmen against the republican party.

The rights of the workingmen must be preceted; he must be premitted to employ every peaceful means to gain his ends; but it will never be conceded that he has a right to take possession of the property of his employer by force. Such destrine incites aparoby and strikes at the baris of all our institutions.—Bee.




