#### A Democratic Mass.

There is much dissatisfaction among the democrats of Holdrege and vicinity over the action of delegates Cowgill and Betz in voting for McKelghan when Mr. Rhea of this county was a delegate. Of course it is a democratic fuss and is "none of our funeral" but it looks as if they ought to have carried out the wishes of those who elected them. No one can deny that Mr. Rhea has done much hard work for his party in this country. Much is heard about visions of postoffice spoils and other patronage figuring in the deal, the truth of which we know not. The democratic club expressed their sentiment in the following manner at the meeting Friday night.

Whereas, Hon. James I. Rhea, our fellow citizen and fellow democrat, was by his friends placed in nomination against Hon. W. A. McKelghan before the congressional convention held at Red Cloud, Neb. September 1, 1892, and

Whereas, Mr. W. H. Cowgill and C. S. Betz, two of the delegates from Phelps county, did not support Mr. Rhea, but instead voted for Mr. McKelghan; be it

Resolved, that we heartily resent and protest against the conduct of the two said delegates as ungentlemanly towards Mr. Rhea and against the sentiments and wishes of the democrats of Phelps county, and be it further

Resolved, that we approve of the conduct of Mr. Rhea in permitting his name to go before said convention and believe in the good judgment and true democracy of those who stood by him, and that we send greetings to the democrats of the Fifth congressional district, notifying them of our action and testifying our abounding faith in the honor and sterling democracy of Mr. Rhea—holdrege citizen.

Congressman Tom Watson, of Georgia, draws an inspiring picture of the democratic attitude on the tariff question. "They went into office," he says, "coming at the mouth of the McKinley tariff bill.
