All meetings will open at 11 a. m. (Webster County Teachers' Institute, Red Cloud, Neb., March 20 to 31st, 1893.)

If any day upon which a meeting is appointed to be held proves to be stormy, the meeting will be held on the following Saturday. A printed program will be sent to each teacher before every meeting.

The reading Circle work will constitute about one-half of the program. It is recommended to those teachers who can do so to form local reading circles.

The printed outline of work for each month, given with the Reading Circle books, will be followed in the study of the books.

Those in the north half of the county are expected to attend the meetings at Blue Hill and Bladen; those in the south half, at Red Cloud and Guide Book; Cowles being a central point, all are expected to be at the Cowles meetings.

The teachers present at each meeting will enroll, and the enrollment sheet will be kept on file at the county superintendent's office for future reference.

Whenever it is absolutely impossible for a teacher to attend a meeting a written excuse should be sent to the superintendent to be filed with the enrollment sheet of that meeting.

The faithful, earnest educational worker should be rewarded. All grades above seventy-nine per cent, on certificates used this year by teachers (or in force) in this county, will be renewed on certificates for the school year '93 and '94 if the persons holding them attend the teachers' meetings regularly and take part in them, so the reading circle work required, and by so doing show a willingness or desire to improve. Those who do not attend the meetings and take part in them will be required to take an examination in all the branches before a certificate will be granted for another year.

Let us make this school year noted as a year of great educational progress in Webster county.
