Neither of the parents were in the house at the time and Miss May went bravely to her brother's rescue and attempted to extinguish the flames. In doing this her clothing caught fire and becoming panic stricken she ran screaming into the street. Her screams brought a number of people to their doors among them Mr. W. A. Seesley who stopped her at his house and who with the greatest difficulty succeeded in putting out the flames, burning his own hands so severely as to be unable to do any work since. By this time a number of others had arrived and she was carried to her home but so severely injured that recovery was impossible. The victim of this sad accident was about fifteen years of age, and one of the brightest and best young girls of this community, a dutiful and obedient daughter, modest in demeanor, pleasant in her deportment toward every one, a studious pupil at school, she was a general favorite with all. That she should thus meet with a violent death just as she was blooming into a beautiful womanhood is sad beyond comparison and the sorrowing relatives have the sincere sympathy of the entire community in their bereavement. —Signal.
