Report of the Citizens' Committee.

We your committee submit the following report and recommendations. On the 29th day of december we caused the arrest of the woman hnown as Nettie Kirk, proprietress of the house of ill fame, and had her taken before Judge Duffy of the county court. She applied she was remanded to jail. After remaining there a number of days she submitthat if the prosecution were dropped and she discharged she would pay the sum of \$115, that being the amount of cost and expenses incurred, and leave the town and never return. This proposition your committee sccepted, and within forty-eight hours she paid the sum and left the town and has not returned. As soon as she was atrested the other inmates of the house thought it prudent to leave the city and have not since returned. The male occupant your committee and induce him to leave town with a promise never to return, upon the committee agreeing to let him

Your committee congraulates the citizens of Red Cloud that this notorious house of prostitution is temporarily at least suppressed. It only remains for the citizens to see that it is kept suppressed. To the end that this and like establishments may not again obtain a foothold in this city, we recommend the appointment by the city council of a competent man as marshall. The city is at present paying for the services of street cemmissioner the sum of \$24 per month when there is not a dollar in the city treasury to be expended on the streets; also to the same officer \$18 per month as water commissioner and 88 per month as city clerk.
