WEATHER FORECASTS

Furnished Expressly for The

St. Joseph, Mo, Feb. 9 .- My last bulletin gave forceasts of the storm waves to cross the continent from Feb. 11th to 15th and the next will reach the Pacific coast about February 22d, cross the western mountains by close of the 23d, the great central valleys from 24 th to 26th, and the eastern states about the 27th

This disturbance will pass through the central portions of the United States and an average rainfall or snow cate the breaking up of frosts and the may be expected over a large part of the country.

The warm wave will cross the western mountains about the 23d, the great central valleys about the 24th, and the castern states about the 26th. The cool wave will cross the western mountains about the 25th, the great central valleys about the 27th, and the eastern states about March 1st.

March will have great extremes of weather, immense rains and snows, and altogether the greatest variety of weather, the greatest extremes that will soon fall. have occured in March for years, This condition will continue till about the 7th of April, after which dry cold weather will continue to the end of the menth.

The weather looks bad for spring farming and while nine times out of en early planting is best, this year appears to be the exception and in the northern corn belt planting in May planting.

There are really no distinct divisons of clouds and class them as one class so gradually merges into the two nearest in appearance that it is quite difficult to distinguish where one stops and another begins.

Meterologists have divided clouds into five general classes: Stratus, cirrus, cumulus, cirro cumulus and nimbus. The stratus is the bed or covering cloud, which at all seasons, but more espacially in autumn, appears near susset and rests all night, till sunrise in the morning, along the edge of the horizon. These clouds seem to be formed of a kind of mist or fog thrown up by the earth, or that has settled down from the dissolved cumulus is positively electrified and but little dew falls when they prevail. They are whitish gray, and must be distinguished from what are sometimes called cirro-stratus. Stratus clouds indicate rain and no dew while the c rro-stratus, belonging to the same class, indicate heavy dews and no rains.

The cirrus is a curled cloud with recurved tufus or wisps. It is the highest of all clouds and is either the cents a day the year round. outflow over the upheaving column of a lew barometer, or remnant or skeleton of an exhausted storm center.
