Boomer, after which the miscellaneous business was disposed of, the convention then listened to a very able paper on "The work of the Sunday-school superintendent" by R. M. Cochran. If all our superintendents would live up to the standard marked out by Mr. Cochran we surely would have model schools. In the afternoon the following officers were elected for the coming year: R. B. Fulton, Pres., Mr. Knight, Vice Pres., Mrs. Drakefield, Sec., and Laura Winter, Sec. A discussion on "How superintendents conduct their schools" a paper on "How to interest church members in Sunday school work" by Mrs. G. P. Catbar and in her absence read by Mrs. Truman, and reports occupied the afternoon. At the close of the session the Sunday school workers departed for their homes, thanking the people of Red Cloud for their kind hospitality, and feeling that their time had been pleasantly and profitably spent.
