

A Juror Arrested For the Crime. SOUTH OMAHA, April 27.—The coro-ner's jury decided that the fire which burned the Lee hotel on the morning of the 21st, in which J. E. Swift lost his life, was of incendiary origin. J. W. Blake and Nick Martin are charged with the crime, and are under arrest. Mar-tin was a member of the jury.

Lincoln Industrials Secure Work. OMAHA, May 3.—A special from Lin-coln says: The superintendent of the Burlington road offered employment to all members of Colonel Duff's company of the industrial army. Sixteen accepted the offer, and were given transportation to Montana. They will work on an ex-tension of the road and will be paid \$1.40 per day. Efforts are being made to organize an army in Omaha. A mass meeting was held for that purpose Tuesday night. About 300 men agreed to join and march to Washington.
