Cody's Fresh Supply of Indians.
RUSHVILLE, Neb., May 3.—Two coachloads of Indians, a new supply for Cody's Wild West, left here for New York.

Acquitted of the Charge.
LEXINGTON, Neb., April 30.—The trial of W. R. Frye for the Dawson county bank and postoffice burglary was finished, resulting in a verdict of not guilty.

Arrested Cattle Rustlers.
CHADRON, Neb., April 30.—Sheriff Dew of Sioux county and Moses of Hot Springs S. D., arrested two cattle rustlers 20 miles northwest of Harrison, Neb. They are George Cobb and James Farnam.

Northwestern Fair Association.
SIOUX CITY, Ia., May 3.—Delegates from nearly 100 counties in northwest Iowa, southwest Minnesota, South Dakota and northern Nebraska are here holding a meeting to perfect the organization of the Interstate Fair association.

Captured a Forger.
NEBRASKA CITY, Neb., April 30.—Sheriff Huberle returned from Harvard, Neb., having in custody S. A. Givens, who is wanted on a charge of forgery committed in Syracuse in 1893. He was bound over to await the action of the district court.

Fatally Burned His Little Sister.
WALLACE, Neb., April 30.—While George Strauss and his wife were making garden a few rods from their house their little boy got hold of a box of matches, setting fire to his little 8-year-old sister's clothes. She died a few hours afterwards.

Natural Gas at Casper.
CHADRON, Neb., April 30.—There is great rejoicing in Casper, Wyo. In two of the oil wells in that vicinity, wells Nos. 2 and 4, natural gas appeared simultaneously. They have only been pumping oil about a month and this has liberated the gas.

President of State W. C. T. U. Married.
FREMONT, Neb., April 30.—Mrs. M. A. Hitchcock, president of the State Women's Christian Temperance union, was married at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. P. E. Lombard, to Mr. Wilson W. Wakelin of Nemaha county, Rev. H. W. Tate officiating.

Reduced Salaries Generally.
GRAND ISLAND, Neb., April 28.—The city council, at a lively meeting, made a reduction in salaries amounting to \$1,340 per year. Councilmen's salaries were reduced \$100 each. The salaries of the police judge, chief engineer and city clerk were each reduced \$100.

Nebraska Creamery Men Meet.
HASTINGS, May 2.—A delegation of creamery men from Sutton, Harvard, Fairmont, Blue Hill, Fairfield, Davenport, Hebron, Superior, Minden, York, Aurora and Hastings met here for consultation and transaction of general business.

Father Corbett's Contempt Case.
PLATTSBOUTH, Neb., May 2.—In the contempt case against Father Corbett the prosecution asked leave to file an amended petition. It was granted and Father Corbett given until Tuesday next to answer. Father Corbett held service at Palmyra on Sunday.

Killed in a Saw Mill.
TABLE ROCK, Neb., May 2.—A terrible accident happened here. William J. Brock was at work about the circular saw in Feller's fence factory and fell on or was caught by the saw and literally sawed to pieces. He was 45 years old and leaves a wife and two children.

Omaha Car Lines Were Blocked.
OMAHA, April 30.—In an effort to enforce collection of a judgment for \$5,000 for personal injuries two of the principal street car lines were blocked in the center of the city for four hours by the sheriff, who levied on the trains as fast as they came up to the junction of Sixteenth and Farnam streets.

A Juror Arrested For the Crime.
SOUTH OMAHA, April 27.—The coroner's jury decided that the fire which burned the Lee hotel on the morning of the 21st, in which J. E. Swift lost his life, was of incendiary origin. J. W. Blake and Nick Martin are charged with the crime, and are under arrest. Martin was a member of the jury.

Lincoln Industrialists Secure Work.
OMAHA, May 3.—A special from Lincoln says: The superintendent of the Burlington road offered employment to all members of Colonel Duff's company of the industrial army. Sixteen accepted the offer, and were given transportation to Montana. They will work on an extension of the road and will be paid \$1.40 per day. Efforts are being made to organize an army in Omaha. A mass meeting was held for that purpose Tuesday night. About 300 men agreed to join and march to Washington.

INTEREST WILL BE DEFAULTED.
Foreclosure of Oregon Railway and Navigation Company's Mortgage Probable.
OMAHA, May 3.—The Bee says that there is an extreme probability that the interest on the Oregon Railway and Navigation company's mortgage \$6 and \$6 will be defaulted for December. This will bring about foreclosure proceedings. This is based on information privately received concerning the nature of the report made by the representatives of the foreign bondholders of the Oregon Railway and Navigation company, Messrs. Dougherty and Cook. These gentlemen went over the ground very thoroughly in January and have reported, so the story goes, adversely to the Union Pacific. The
