WOMEN IN BUSINESS.

THEY ARE TAKING UP MANY MASCULINE VOCATIONS.

Large Commercial Enterprises Successfully Managed by the Gentler Sex - They Are Also Engaged at Callings Which Require Skill and Physical Endurance.

Women are found today in many an employment which until very recently was regarded as the exclusive privilege of man.

One woman in this city who had an excellent musical education in her youth took a thorough and systematic course in the theoretical study and practice of piano tuning and soon proved her capacity in excelling the male competitors in the establishment.

The first woman railroad president in this country succeeded her husband on his death. He was the president of the Pennsboro and Harrisville railroad.

At 1:45 o'clock, before any action had been taken on the resolution, Mr. Harris moved to take up a resolution providing that "tomorrow and until otherwise ordered the senate shall meet at 11 o'clock a. m."

Senators Peffer and Allen objected to the pending resolution being displaced and demanded a ye and nay vote. The vote (which also showed the attitude of the senate on Mr. Allen's resolution) was as follows: Yeas, 54; nays, 6.

WASHINGTON, April 26. - Hepburn (la.) interposed his daily objection to the approval of the journal in the house Thursday and compelled a roll call, which resulted in its approval - 237 to 0.

WASHINGTON, April 27. - The campaign Mr. Hepburn (Rep.) has been waging in the house the past week to secure time for the passage of pension bills favorably acted upon at the Friday night sessions culminated in a victory today.

Hale, Teller and Aldrich on one side, and Harris and Voorhees on the other, upon the question why no better progress is being made with the tariff bill.

WASHINGTON, April 30. - In the house Mr. Melkelohn (Neb.) called up the bill for the construction of a bridge across the Missouri river near the town of Nebraska City, Neb., and it was passed.

WASHINGTON, May 1. - The senate and house each adjourned today almost as soon as the session began, out of respect of Senator Stockbridge's memory.

WASHINGTON, May 2. - Frank Hatten, editor of the Washington Post, died at 8:30 p. m. Monday.

WORK OF NATIONAL LAWMAKERS.

Iowa Congressman Finally Gets the House to Take Action on Pension Bills.

WASHINGTON, April 25. - The senate presented an appearance of calm after the storm Wednesday. The galleries were only half filled, while the Democratic senators gave evidence of relief that the first step in the tariff debate was concluded, coupled with a determination to carry on the work.
