Mr. F. W. BARBER of Grand Island was in Red Cloud this week looking his chances over for the delegation to the republican state convention for State Superintendent of public instruction.

### Nebraska Moonshiners.

Deputy United States Marshal Tomlinson or Red Cloud brought in Joel Z. Teter and W. G. Arbogast, the moonshiners operating the illicit still near Indianola. It is stated that Teter brought the still from Pendleton county, West Virginia in 1889 and has since operated it in various places in the vicinity of Indianola. It was first set up in a cave in the bluffs near Teter's brewery, and after the brewery was sold the still was moved to Teter's farm and later to Kearney. The last location and the place where the plant was seized was on the farm of Arbogast, a brother-in-law of Teter about 13 miles from Indianola.

It seems that the operators had an inkling that there was likely to be trouble and had made application for a license, but when they found that the tax would be 90 cents a gallon they delayed action. When Deputy Internal Revenue Collector Ballew and Deputy Marshal Tomlinson went out to the Arbogast farm to find the still, they encountered Arbogast and his son plowing in a field about a mile from the house. Ballew told Arbogast that he had come out to measure the still before granting the license. Arbogast quietly gave his son a signal and the latter detached one of the horses from the plow and struck out for the house on a gallop. The cause was ascertained when the officers arrived as they found that the cup and worm had been disconnected from the kettle and were missing. The culprit was cornered, and finally admitted that he had concealed the missing parts, and showed where they were hidden. The plant was

in an outbuilding, and had been set up and connected in full running order. Just how much proof the officers have obtained they of course refuse to disclose in advance, but they have more than they need. Teter, who has been engaged in bootlegging the illicitly distilled whisky, was captured on the road shortly before midnight.—Omaha Bee.
