spiral toward the earth, and one high will attract another. They often unite and the transient highs from the northwest always plunge into the permanent high of the North Atlantic which is their nirvana, and in which they are absorbed and lost.

"Currents repel each other when they move in opposite directions," says the authority quoted. This accounts for the fact that high and low barometers repel each other, and although they bug each other closely, they never so far unite as to become one.

The same law that governs the planets applies to the high and low barometers. The planets attract each other till their electrospheres meet, and then they repel. It is a mistake to suppose that sun, planets and comets universally attract each other. Repulsion is universal as soon as the electrospheres of the bodies meet.

Comets plunge deep into the sun's electrosphere—which extends far out beyond the orbit of Neptune—but the "fire is knocked out of them" by their friction against the elements surrounding the sun, and they reach close quarters with the sun only by the momentum they gain before reaching the sun's electrosphere.

It is also an error to suppose that the tails of comets continue throughout their orbits. These tails only show up after the comets have reached the sun's electrospheres, after repulsion and friction have taken the place of attraction, as it is erroneously called.

Extending the laws quoted above to a large scale, we have permanent lows at the earth's geographical poles, over the Behring sea, surrounding Iceland, and at corresponding points on the hemisphere. In all of these the currents are downward. Upward currents are found in the permanent highs covering the north Atlantic, north Pacific, the central portions of the North American and Asiatic continents, and corresponding points on the southern hemisphere.

Each of these great permanent and stationary areas of high barometers, through which currents move downward, attract all transient highs and repel all transient lows, while each of the great permanent and stationary low barometers, through which currents move upward, attract all transient lows and repel all transient highs.

It is known that an overcharged body will throw off bodies of electricity, and when the sun, moon or planets move into a position that increases electrical action, then the permanent highs throw off bodies of downpouring currents which constitute our cold waves or transient highs, and at the same time the permanent lows throw off bodies of uppouring currents, which constitute our warm wave or transient lows.

The high and low barometers conform to all the laws of electricity, and never conform to the laws of heat. Then why is it that our national weather bureau continues to spend the nation's money trying to establish the erroneous theory that heat, sun heat is the cause of all weather changes?
