Weather Bulletin.

(Copyrighted, 1885, by W. T. Foster.)

St. JOSEPH, Mo., Jan. 26.—My last bulletin gave forecasts of the storm wave to cross the continent from 25th to 29th, and the next will reach the Pacific coast about the 30th, cross the western mountain country by close of 31st, the great central valleys from Feb. 1 to 3 and the eastern states about the 4th.

Temperatures will average low during this period following the storm wave and precipitation will be above the average of the month.

The second February disturbance will reach the Pacific coast about the 5th, cross the western mountain country by close of 6th, the great central valleys from 7th to 9th and the eastern states about the 10th.

This disturbance will increase in force as it moves eastward and general precipitation will not amount to much.

The principal feature of this disturbance will be the cold wave following it, which will probably amount to a blizzard in the northeastern states. Warm waves will cross the western mountain country about January 30th and February 5th, the great central valleys February 1st and 7th, and the eastern states 31 and 9th. Cool waves will cross the western mountain country about February 2d and 8th, the great central valleys 4th and 10th, and the eastern states 6th and 12th.

FEBRUARY TEMPERATURE AND RAIN.
On the Atlantic and Pacific coasts, upper and lower lakes, and in the Ohio valley the temperature of February will average below, and the rainfall about normal. In Texas, Mississippi and Missouri valleys, the temperature will average above and the rainfall about or below normal.

My forecasts of temperature and rainfall for December, similar to the above, based on discoveries made in 1892 and partially worked out since, proved 90 per cent. correct. I cannot expect to keep up that average, however, till the calculations are completed.

The principal feature of storm features of February will probably be: First half of month warmer than last half, warmest part of month just preceding the storm wave to cross continent from 6th to 11th; coldest cold waves following this storm and the one to cross from 23d to 27th. Last part of month will be best ice weather in northern states except a day or two at beginning of the month.

Will give details of the spring drouth in next bulletin.

THE MAGNETIC NEEDLE.

Twenty-one years, 1850 to 1870 inclusive, daily temperature at Chicago averaged 46.4 degrees above zero and twenty-one years, 1871 to 1891, the average was 48.7 degrees. This shows that the temperature taken every day for two periods of twenty-one years each averaged 1.3 degrees warmer during the last period.

The above is in accord with a long train of facts in reference to the climate of North America. It is well known that, many years ago, the winters were much more severe in the upper Mississippi valley and about the upper lakes than they have been of more recent years.

If the reader will bear in mind that the prevailing winds are from the north on the east side of the north magnetic pole, the center of which is now northwest of Baffin's bay; it will readily appear that as that magnetic pole moves westward, these prevailing north winds will have less force at Chicago and east of that point about the lower lakes until the western part of the Icelandic low north magnetic pole is reached.

As shown in a previous study the Icelandic low is also moving westward and in its western parts the prevailing winds are also from the north, resulting in increased cold.

At New Bedford, Massachusetts, the daily temperature for twenty-one years—1813 to 1834 inclusive—averaged .86 of a degree warmer than for the twenty-one years, 1868 to 1888 inclusive. From an older record at Philadelphia, the daily temperature from 1808 to 1828 averaged 4.5 degrees warmer than from 1867 to 1886.

These evidences are very conclusive that the climate is changing to warmer in the upper Missouri valley and upper lake countries, and to colder in the northeastern states. The cause can be none other than the westward movements of the magnetic north poles.

In America the compass indicates a continuous westward movement of the north magnetic pole, but in northern Europe, particularly in London, there are indications of vacillat and a returning to the eastward of the Icelandic magnetic pole.

It is not reasonable to suppose that the Icelandic pole moves eastward while the North American is moving westward and the electricians are deceived about it in this way.

The magnetic needle does not point directly toward the center of the magnetic pole to which it owes allegiance, and therefore a slight variation east or west does not indicate that the center of the magnetic pole has moved.

To arrive at right conclusions about this matter one must keep in view the cause that keeps the magnetic needle pointing northward. The cause is not the north magnetic pole but the lines of force that surround that pole.

Electricians say we do not know which way electricity moves, or, if it moves at all, its direction is opposite to that of matter. They would say that if electricity causes the wind to blow, the electricity and the wind move in opposite directions.

I cannot understand such philosophy. I believe that electricity carries matter with it and that the ether of space flows in the opposite direction to the movements of electrical currents.

All agree that a force surrounds the north magnetic poles of the earth situated in North America and northeastern Asia, where perpetual high barometers are found. That force is represented by lines, weaker as we recede from the pole or center, but there are no lines about it any more than there are lines in the atmosphere. When these lines of force strike the magnetic needle it takes position at right angles to the lines or directly across them.

These lines of force approximate to circles with the magnetic pole as their center, but from many causes they often break away from their circular form, causing the needle to vary and this variation deceives the electricians, leading them to conclude that the general variation of the needle is changing.
