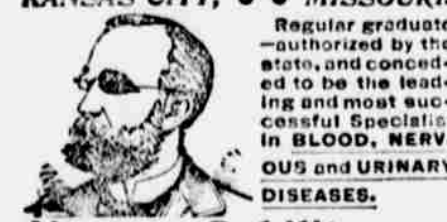

TOWNSHIP ORGANIZATION.

The New System Under Which Townships will be Operated.

(House Bill No. 66.)

AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 66. Amendment to section 4. In line four of section four, say seven for five.

Amendment to section five. In line 2 of section 5, instead of the word five insert seven.

After the word "provided" in line 14, section 4, insert the following: Provided further, that if any such city has more than the requisite inhabitants for two districts, then and in such event sufficient outlying territory may be added to such city to make three districts.

In section 4, line 13, strike out the words "a double numbers," and insert in lieu thereof the word "number."

To section 5, after the word "two" at the end of line 3, add the words "or more."

In line 5, section 7, strike out the word "two" in both places when it precedes the word supervisors and insert "four."

In line 5, section 8, strike out the word "five" and insert the word "seven."

After "require" in line 4, section 52: Provided, however, that notices of such meeting shall be posted in three conspicuous places at least 10 days before such meeting.

Strike out all of section 76.

SEC. 55. The board shall require all accounts presented to be verified by affidavit, setting forth that the same are correct and just and unpaid.

SEC. 56. Said board shall make a certificate to be signed by a majority of said board, specifying the value of the claim and to when the amount is allowed, and shall cause such certificate to be delivered to the town clerk of said town, to be by him kept on file for the inspection of all persons, and a certified statement shall be made by him at once delivered to the county clerk, who shall lay such statement or statements by him received from the several town clerks before the board of supervisors of the county at their regular annual meeting.

SEC. 57. The following shall be deemed town charges, to-wit: The compensation of town officers for services rendered their respective towns, contingent expenses necessarily incurred for the use and benefit of the town, the moneys authorized by the vote of the town meeting for any town purposes, and every sum directed by law to be raised for town purposes.

SEC. 58. The moneys necessary to defray the town charges of each town shall be levied on the taxable property in such town, in the manner prescribed by law for raising revenue. The rate of taxes for town purposes shall not exceed: for roads, two mills on each dollar of the valuation; for bridges, two mills on each dollar of the valuation; for all other purposes three mills on each dollar of the valuation. And if the electors at the annual town meeting fail to vote a tax to pay the town charges hereinbefore specified, or the town board fail to certify up to the county board the amount of tax voted, if any, by a town meeting, then the county board shall have the power and it shall be the duty of such board to levy upon the taxable property in said town a tax sufficient to pay all such town charges. (Amended 1885, Chapter 42.)

SEC. 59. The following town officers shall be entitled to compensation as follows: Town treasurer, three per centum of the amount collected by him as taxes, excepting on school taxes he shall receive one per centum; the town clerk, town assessor and justice of the peace each shall receive two dollars for each day actually and necessarily employed in attending to town business. This shall not apply to assessors' fees for listing property, which fees shall be governed by existing law governing assessors' fees. Provided, that the town clerk shall receive fees for the following services and not a per diem: For serving notices of election as required by law, twenty-five (25) cents each; filing papers, ten (10) cents each; posting notices as required by law, twenty-five (25) cents each; for recording any order or instrument of writing author-

ized by law, five cents for each hundred words; for copying any record in his office and certifying the same, ten cents for each one hundred words, to be paid by the person applying for the same; and for copying by laws, for posting or publication, five cents for each one hundred words.

SEC. 60. The members of the town board shall be entitled to two dollars per day each for their services while actually engaged in their duties as such board.

SEC. 61. No justice of the peace or town officer shall be entitled to any fee or compensation from any individual elected or chosen to a town office for administering to him the oath of office.

SEC. 62. When any controversy or cause of action shall exist between any towns of this state, or between any town and individual or corporation, proceedings may be had or suits brought, either at law or in equity, for the purpose of trying and finally settling such controversies. In all such suits and proceedings the town shall sue and be sued by its corporation name, except when town officers shall be authorized by law to sue in their names of office for the benefit of the town.

SEC. 63. In all legal proceedings against the town by name, the first process and all other writs or proceedings required to be served shall be served on the town clerk of the town, and whenever any suit or proceedings shall be commenced against the town, it shall be the duty of the town clerk to attend to the defense thereof, and lay before the electors of the town, at the first town meeting, a full statement of such suit or proceeding for their consideration and direction.
