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An Act to Provide Free Attendance at Public High Schools.

(House Roll No. 283.)

The county superintendent desir s that teachers, patrons and school efficers read the following new school law, carefully.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLA-TURE OF THE STATE OF NEBRASKA: Section 1. Sec. 4. The county board of each county in this state shall levy annually a sufficient tax to meet the expenses contemplated by the provisions of this act, said tax not to exceed one mill on the dollar of the assessed valuation of said county for the preceding year, to be levied and collectey in the manner provided by law for the month term of school last Friday the levying and collection of other count. taxes; and the tunds so acquired shall constitute a county school fund; Provided, That school districts which maintain schools designated by the state department of education, as provided in section two this act, shall be exempt from such levy.
