Weather Bulletin.

ST. JOSEPH, Mo., Aug. 3.—My last bulletin gave forecasts of the storm waves to cross the continent from Aug. 4th to 8th. The next will reach the Pacific coast about Aug. 9th, cross the western mountain country by close of 10th, the great central valleys from 11th to 13th, and the eastern states about the 14th.
Average rainfall may be expected from this disturbance, principally along the central latitudes of the United States.
The warm wave will cross the west of Rockies country about 9th, great central valleys 11th and eastern states 13th. Cool wave will cross the

west of Rockies country about 12th, great central valleys 14th, and the eastern states 16th.
August is the most difficult month of the year for which to forecast the severe storms. It is one of the tropical storm months, and as we are not yet able to definitely forecast these tropical storms, and as they always break up the regular weather conditions on the continent, the dates of dangerous storms become uncertain.
Indications, however, are that within a few days of August 6th and 19th the most severe storms of August will occur on the continent, and the tropical hurricanes will be of greatest force on our Atlantic coast within a few days of the 20th. Near August 6th will also be a favorable date for severe tropical storms.
I expect the greatest tropical hurricane of the year to occur within a few days of September 18th. Mark the date and watch the reports. I can not give the location except that its force will be felt along the southern coast of the United States.

PLANT FOOD.
The state and national experimental stations have long endeavored to discover the process of furnishing plant food to growing vegetation, but have totally and universally failed.
The experiments have included this line: For example, they analyze a potato and ascertain all the ingredients of its makeup, and this analysis probably reveals the various kinds of solid matter and liquids contained in the potato. But when they try to unite these elements of the potato again, so as to make potato meat, the result is a marked failure, and the substance thus produced is very unlike the meat of the potato.
The trouble with the scientific agriculturists is that, like our national weather bureau, they started out with a wrong theory, and in trying to reconstruct the potato they have left out the life principle.
In his New System of Meteorology—twenty years old—Prof. Tice, of St. Louis, declares there is a fourth physical force which he calls constitutism, the other orthodox three being light, heat and electricity.
This constitutism is the spirit of matter, the force that holds organized bodies together, the life principle. Take that principle away and all things crumble to atoms, and even atoms would disorganize and become ether.

When certain gases are chemically combined they, as water, occupy 3000 times less space than they did as gases. But to form water of these gases a somewhat (?) goes out, electricity and heat are developed, and this process progresses as matter continues to change toward the solid, in what is called the descending scale.
When matter disintegrates, evaporates, expands, electricity and cold are developed and the amount of constitutism is increased. This is the ascending scale.
When one pound of hydrogen is chemically combined with half its volume of oxygen to form water, enough heat is developed to raise 124,000 pounds of water one degree in temperature, while the reverse action develops enough cold to lower the

same amount of water one degree.
Now to the potato again. When the scientific agricultural experimenter analyzes the potato he sets free a very considerable amount of heat and electricity. All vegetables are magnets containing currents of electricity.
When the experimenter undertakes to put these elements together again to form potato meat he neglects the somewhat (?), the latent heat and the electric current, and without these he cannot reform the potato or potato meat.
When he dissected, disintegrated, expanded, analyzed the potato, he killed its spirit, its somewhat (?), its constitutism, dissipated its heat and its magnetism, and all these must be restored in order to reconstitute the potato.
As the experimenter does not understand the mode by which nature constitutes organisms, and as he fails in trying to reconstitute the potato, or other vegetable or fruit, all his work is lost and he still gropes in darkness, because he cannot discover the ingredients of plant food and the proper mode of furnishing it to the soil so that the plant will take it up.
This predicament of the orthodox scientist comes from his orthodoxy. Having no mind of his own, he accepts the text books which are gory with blotches where the shadows of the dark ages fell on them.
The idea, with as dark a hue as the atyrian shades, that vegetation sucks its substance from the soil is akin to the other sable orthodox ideas on which the national weather bureau bases all its researches, that heat comes from the sun through space that is at least 461 degrees below zero.
A strong steady current through the vegetable into the earth is the all important necessity and if the scientific agriculturalist would devote his time to finding the best mode of securing that current he might earn his salary.
You can not change a cabbage to a tomato by changing the soil. You may throw around the roots of a poisonous plant any fertilizer you choose and the plant will continue to be poisonous. The plant either draws the poison from the atmosphere and deposits it in the earth, or if the poisons are originally in the soil they evaporate and are caught by the leaves of the plant and returned to the earth by the decay of the vegetable.

The only hope of supplying plant food is to place something in the soil that will evaporate, and that must be a doubtful experiment.
In tropical climates air plants thrive on dead trees, the roots of the plant extending out into the atmosphere, and as these air plants certainly obtain all their plant food through the atmosphere it is very strong evidence that all vegetation receives all nourishment from above.
