

Special examinations will be held on the Friday preceeding the 3d Saturday of each month.



DEFENSE FOR WALLER.

The Ex-Consul's American Counsel Make

Out a Strong Case. WASHINGTON, July 25 .- Mr. Crammond Kennedy, who has become the principal counsel in the case of ex-Consul Waller, now serving a sentence in a French jail for violation of neutrality laws between this country and France, called at the state department yesterday for the purpose of presenting certain phases of the case.

Mr. Kennedy is disposed to lay much stress on the fact that at the time of Waller's arrest there was no actual

Waller's arrest, there was no actual state of war between France and Madagascar. He contends that Waller, for this reason, could not have been guilty of the charge on which he was tried and convicted. In conversation with a representative of the press he said this phase of the case had not yet been presented by this government, and as soon as Mr. Olney should re-turn he would present the matter to him in this light.

Ordinance No. 62.

Annual appropriation ordinance for the municipal year commencing May 1, 1895, and ending May 1, 1896. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City

Council of the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska.

Sec 1. That the following sums be appropriated to the following purposes: For sidewalks and streets, in

addition to the poll tax..... \$ 240 00 For coal...... 1000 00 For maintainance of the poor .. 200 00 For repairs of water system For official salaries..... For incidentals, stationery, &c.. 156 00 For payment of bills of preceding year, for which no war-

rants have been drawn 360 45 for water commissioner, enginee:, and labor on the mains

and water system 696 00 The bills of last year referred to are hose incurred for maintainance of poor and the salary of engineer.

Sec. 2. Said sums shall be appropriated out of the following funds:

The salary of water commissioner, engineer, and expenditures for repairs of system and mains, shall be paid out of Nebraska's excellent National the water rents and charges. The residue Guards-infantry, cavalry and artill of said fund if any shall be used for purchase of coal.

Expenditures for streets and sidewalks shall be paid out of the occupation tax, and the residue of said fund shall be used for the payment of coal bills, including drayage and freight charges for

Official salaries, maintenance of poor, payment of last year's bills provided in section one, and incidentals shall be paid ont of the general fund. Enough warrants shall be drawn on the general fund to pay any residue of coal charges not paid out of occupation and water rent fund.

Interest on bonds shall be paid out of their respective bond levies.

Sec. 3. Any moneys that may be paid to the treasurer from the levies of previous years, after the warrants of those years have been paid, and any moneys or funds not otherwise appropriated by this ordinence, shall be appropriated for the payment of outstanding accounts for which no warrants have been drawn other than those mentioned in section one.

Sec. 4. The several funds with the amounts appropriated are as follows ex cepting interest, funds and debts: Water rents estimated...... \$ 900 00 Appropriated for salaries of en-

gineer and commissioner.... Coal.... Occupation tax realized 1000 00 Appropriated for streets and sidewalks..... For outstanding..... For Coal..... General Fund 85 per cent of the levy...... 1687 30 Appropriated for official salaries 670 00 Maintenance of poor 200 00 Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take


