**Camp Sherman, Hastings, Neb., Aug. 26 to 31.**

The local reunion committee at Hastings, and people generally, are busy making preparations for the greatest gathering of old soldiers and citizens ever assembled together on Nebraska soil. It will be a gala week in Hastings, and a royal welcome awaits every old soldier and citizen in the west.

The veterans of the Kansas-Nebraska Association promise to excel in numbers the attendance of any previous gathering. Fully 50,000 citizens of Kansas will join in this grand reunion.

The Nebraska Band Union, embracing over 600 uniformed men, will hold their annual reunion on the same dates. There will be music galore.

Band contest on Saturday morning. Two cash prizes, \$75 first; \$50 second. Free for all. Bands expecting to enter must report at headquarters Tuesday noon.

Nebraska's excellent National Guards—infantry, cavalry and artillery—has been ordered into camp at Hastings during the reunion of the old soldiers.

The local committee has contracted with one of the largest manufacturers of fire works in the United States for a special display of fire works on Monday and Friday evenings. Signal shells, fired from mortars, and handsome set pieces—suggestive of the occasion—will be one of the charming features of the week's program.

Sham battle Friday—under command of Gen. Jno. M. Thayer and Gen. C. J. Dilworth will arouse old time activity and admiration.

There will be Gatling gun practice daily by the Omaha Guard, and artillery duel, cavalry duel, and fancy drill work by the National Guard.

The citizens of Hastings are preparing accommodations for a quarter million people.

Camp Sherman will be turned over to Department Commander Adams at 2 p. m. Monday, when hostilities will commence in earnest.

Six balloon ascensions and parachute drops by one of the leading aeronauts of the country.

Prominent among the speakers from Kansas, will be Ex-Senator John J. Ingalls, Gov. Morrill, Bernard Kelly, and D. R. Anthony.

The Nebraska Congressional delegation, Ex Dept. Commanders of the G. A. R. will also be present, and other prominent speakers.

**Ordinance No. 62.**

Annual appropriation ordinance for the municipal year commencing May 1, 1895, and ending May 1, 1896.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska.

Sec 1. That the following sums be appropriated to the following purposes: For sidewalks and streets, in addition to the poll tax..... \$ 240 00 For coal..... 1000 00 For maintenance of the poor... 200 00 For repairs of water system.... 204 00 For official salaries..... 670 00 For incidentals, stationery, &c... 156 00 For payment of bills of preceding year, for which no warrants have been drawn..... 360 45 For water commissioner, engineer, and labor on the mains and water system..... 696 00 The bills of last year referred to are those incurred for maintenance of poor and the salary of engineer.

Sec. 2. Said sums shall be appropriated out of the following funds: The salary of water commissioner, engineer, and expenditures for repairs of system and mains, shall be paid out of the water rents and charges. The residue of said fund if any shall be used for purchase of coal.

Expenditures for streets and sidewalks shall be paid out of the occupation tax, and the residue of said fund shall be used for the payment of coal bills, including drayage and freight charges for the same.

Official salaries, maintenance of poor, payment of last year's bills provided in section one, and incidentals shall be paid out of the general fund. Enough warrants shall be drawn on the general fund to pay any residue of coal charges not paid out of occupation and water rent fund.

Interest on bonds shall be paid out of their respective bond levies.

Sec. 3. Any moneys that may be paid to the treasurer from the levies of previous years, after the warrants of those years have been paid, and any moneys or funds not otherwise appropriated by this ordinance, shall be appropriated for the payment of outstanding accounts for which no warrants have been drawn other than those mentioned in section one.

Sec. 4. The several funds with the amounts appropriated are as follows excepting interest, funds and debts: Water rents estimated..... \$ 900 00 Appropriated for salaries of engineer and commissioner..... 696 00 Coal..... 204 00 Occupation tax realized..... 1000 00 Appropriated for streets and sidewalks..... 240 00 For outstanding..... 260 85 For Coal..... 495 15 General Fund 85 per cent of the levy..... 1687 30 Appropriated for official salaries 670 00 Maintenance of poor..... 200 00 Outstanding debts..... 360 45 For incidentals..... 156 00 Coal..... 300 85

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its final passage and publication.
